There has been great discussion around recognition in our constitution, but where is the acknowledgement that this land has never been ceded? Where is the recognition that basic rights are being denied and no redress is being made? Australia is the only Commonwealth country that has not negotiated a Treaty with its First Peoples, allowing their rights to be continually attacked by measures like the still ongoing Northern Territory Intervention:

“Under the Intervention we lost our rights as human beings, as Australian citizens, as First People of the Land. We feel very deeply the threat to our languages, our culture and our heritage. Through harsh changes we have had removed from us all our control over our communities and our lives. Our lands have been compulsorily taken from us. We have been left with nothing.”
